PATRICK WALKINSHAW, M.A.
(Glasgow 1570; min. of Stewenton in 1581; trans. to Kilmarnock in 1583; trans. and adm. in 1589 to Monkland); pres. by James VI. in 1589; a member of Assembly in 1602; a member of the Court of High Commission 15th Feb. 1610; dnd Aug. 1624, aged about 66. "In wealthy circumstances"; his inventory including debts owing to him amounting to £3783, 13s. 1d. Scots. He mar. Isobel Boyd, and left issue — James, M.A., min. of Glasgow 1624; Jean (mar., cont. 4th Sept. 1624, Andrew, eldest son of William Stirling of Leys); Christian; Janet, who chose curators 2nd Nov. 1624 — Peter Walkinshaw of Barnhill, and Robert Boyd of Clerkland, nearest of kin on father's and mother's side. — [Eng. 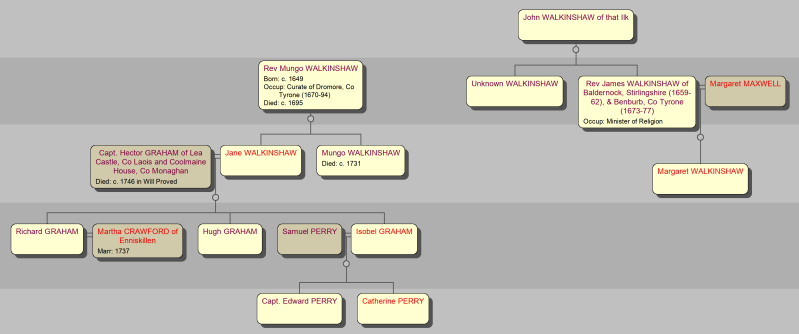

545 WALKINSHAW, JAMES, Drumart, Co. Armagh, gent., 29 Oct. 1728. *Narrative*, 1 p., 3 March 1730/31.
His wife Margaret Walkinshaw, cont. His only son James Walkinshaw, under twenty-one years. His brother-in-law Joseph Boyd of Armagh, apothecary, cont. "Patrick's said wife, James Kirkpatrick and Joseph Boyd, guardians of his said son and six daughters. His then living issue, last one, as Deceased."
